About Survey

In the 2023-2024 academic year, the IQAC at PRSU, Raipur, conducted an online Student Satisfaction Survey on the Teaching-Learning Process using Google Forms. Students across various Schools of Studies at the university took part in the survey, yielding 1045 responses. Notably, 96.1% of these responses were from first-time participants. The gender distribution among participants was 56.7% female and 43.3% male. Regarding educational levels, 26.2% were in graduation courses, 65.2% in post-graduation, and the remainder in PG Diploma, Diploma, Certificate, and Ph.D. programs. The respondents' subject areas were diversified: 12.1% from Arts & Humanities, 3.8% Social Sciences, 48.7% from Science, 23.3% from Professional fields, and 12.1% from other disciplines.


That online feedback form consists of 20 questions with five options on a 0-4 Likert scale. The questions are given below in a table.

Question 21 was qualitative in nature, allowing students the chance to offer suggestions for enhancing the teaching and learning experience. The details of the feedback analysis are as follows:


Question No. 1: How much of the syllabus was covered in the class?

76.7% of students reported that at least 70% of their syllabus was covered in class.


Question No. 2: How well did the teachers prepare for the classes?

Question No. 3: How well were the teachers able to communicate?




3. How well were the teachers able to communicate?


Question No. 4: The teacher's approach to teaching can best be described as


According to 37% and 42.7% of the students, fairness of the internal evaluation process by the teachers is 'usually fair' and 'always fair,' respectively.


About 36.9% of students said that their performances in assignments were discussed with them every time and 34.3% of students claimed that it is usually discussed.



Question No. 8: The teaching and mentoring process in your institution facilitates you in cognitive, social and emotional growth.


8. The teaching and mentoring process in your institution facilitates you in cognitive, social and emotional growth.

Question No. 9: The institution provides multiple opportunities to learn and grow.




9. The institution provides multiple opportunities to learn and grow. 1,045 responses

Question No. 11: Your mentor does a necessary follow-up with an assigned task to you.



Question No. 12: The teachers illustrate the concepts through examples and applications.


12. The teachers illustrate the concepts through examples and applications. 1,045 responses

Question No. 13: The teachers identify your strengths and encourage you with providing right level of challenges.


13. The teachers identify your strengths and encourage you with providing right level of challenges. 1,045 responses

Question No. 14: Teachers are able to identify your weaknesses and help you to overcome them.


14. Teachers are able to identify your weaknesses and help you to overcome them. 1,045 responses

Question No. 15: The institution makes effort to engage students in the monitoring, review and continuous quality improvement of the teaching learning process.


15. The institution makes effort to engage students in the monitoring, review and continuous quality improvement of the teaching learning process. 1,045 responses


Question No. 16: The institute/ teachers use student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies for enhancing learning experiences.

Question No. 17: Teachers encourage you to participate in extracurricular activities.




17. Teachers encourage you to participate in extracurricular activities. 1,045 responses



Question No. 19: What percentage of teachers use ICT tools such as LCD projector, Multimedia, etc. while teaching?

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

Thirty seven percent of students responded that more than 90% of teachers use ICT tools, such as LCD projectors, multimedia, online teaching apps, etc. while teaching, whereas 34% of students reported that 70-89% of teachers use ICT tools while teaching.

In a nutshell, about 31% of the students strongly agreed and 43% agreed that the overall quality of the teaching-learning process in the university is very good.

Following are some observations/ suggestions by students to improve the overall teachinglearning experience in the institution:

- More faculties are needed. Overall, the teachers are very supportive and encouraging.
- Three things to improve overall teaching: 1-Teachers with thorough knowledge of the subject should teach us; 2- Site visit should be done often since we have Professional course; 3- And the most important one is that there should be classes to improve the soft skills like 2/3 classes per week.
- To arrange more no. of machine, like autoclave and instruments like microscopes.
- Instruments used for practical experiments should meet the standards of international level like ISO 14000 series and should be 100 % accessible to students. Research activities should be conducted in the department by the research scholars and professors, inclusively with the master's students for better exposure with the ongoing research in the department and getting updated with the national level research activities.
- More practical and less theoretical classes; Use of inclusive and diversified pedagogical approaches; Use of ICT and multimedia tools
- Hands on training to every student, More use of technology, Animation based example, Communication should be enhanced.
- Companies should integrate with departments to hire students on the basis of skills.
- Students have varying levels of understanding, interests, and learning paces, which can affect their overall learning experience.
- Field visit, placement, national level workshop
